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Additional Considerations:

1. Our presses use the industry standard CMYK color space as opposed to the RGB color space used on the internet. This can result in color shifts that need attention. **2.** Printing presses require image resolutions over 3X that of images used online (300 dpi vs. 72 dpi). **3.** Presses normally gain red over the space of a print run as a general rule. 4. Unless your computer monitor is color-corrected for printing, you may view greens and blues very differently than how they will print, especially when it comes to pastel colors. They may even appear gray. 5. Colors appear much brighter onscreen than on paper because of the RGB color shift and the illumination of your screen's light source. 6. The ambient light in your office space can change color perception. 7. Large areas of solid color need to use shades of CMYK inks to create depth such as the use of Rich Black instead of just one color black for

best ink coverage. 8. Oversaturated color breaks, such as 100% of each of the four CMYK colors are not acceptable as this creates drying issues on press. If you are unsure, please ask your Bluegrass sales person or project manager to help you with interpreting these issues. We are all striving for the same outcome: your satisfaction with the end product.
